Exodus 14:5-22 *And Moses said to the people, "Fear not, stand firm, and see the salvation of the Lord, which he will work for you today; for the Egyptians whom you see today, you shall never see again. The Lord will fight for you, and you have only to be still."* (vv.13-14 RSV)

Do you ever wonder if the Lord is mighty enough to handle your problems? In much of my thinking the Lord is too small—I don't think big enough! "This problem is too big to be solved by one person," would be my thought. Well, if He can part the sea with the stroke of His hand, shouldn't that be convincing enough for us? "You only have to be still." Be refreshed and reminded that He is mighty enough and big enough to handle any of our problems.

After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.
