
Opening Acclamation

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Acts 16:9-15

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them. We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us. The Word of the Lord. *People:* **Thanks be to God.**

A reading from the Book of Revelation

Revelation 21:10, 22-22:5

In the spirit the angel carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God. I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day-- and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life. Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever. The Word of the Lord. *People:* **Thanks be to God.**

Celebrant: Father of life, Author of love, in raising your Son from the grave all of creation has been reborn. May the life and love of the Paschal mystery, which we celebrate today, be a constant and lasting reality in our lives. We ask this through Christ, our Risen Lord. **Amen.**

Church Periodical Club, better known as CPC was founded in 1888. CPC has 2 parts: National Book Fund (NBF) and is the first National granting fund of the Church Periodical Club since 1922. This fund helps meet religious and secular needs by providing, printed and Audio-visual materials to individuals, Churches and organizations affiliated with the Anglican Communion. Grant applications for the National Book Funds are processed after receiving the endorsement of the Episcopal or Anglican Bishop. Contribution in the National Book Fund is distributed twice per year by the NBF committee.

Miles of Pennies better known as (M.O.P), second part of CPC Facts..... The Miles of Pennies Fund was established in 1988 on the 100th birthday of Church Periodical Club. The Miles of Pennies Fund committee awarded the first grant in 1991. The maximum grant given by Miles of Pennies is \$844.80, which represents one mile of pennies. The grant serves the needs of children from kindergarten through high school by providing books and related materials where there is a need worldwide.
